OVERDOSE

An overdose means having too much of a drug and/or alcohol for your body to safely handle. Anyone who uses drugs or medications can overdose. Signs and symptoms of overdose may look different depending on the drug used. If you suspect an overdose, get help immediately- call 911.

Naloxone is a medication that can reverse an overdose that is caused by an opioid drug. When administered during an overdose, Naloxone blocks the effects of opioids on the brain.

Act 139 and Standing Order signed by Physician General, has increased access to Naloxone for all Pennsylvanians.

Prior to administration of Naloxone, persons are strongly advised to complete one of the online training programs approved by Pennsylvania Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs.

24/7 EMERGENCY DETOXIFICATION SERVICES:

The White Deer Run Admissions Support Center has 24/7 coverage and has been designed to expedite detox placement for all funding sources, for all populations. It is, however, our policy, that pregnant woman shall receive preferential treatment in all levels of care, throughout the drug & alcohol treatment continuum.

ACCESSING TREATMENT

Adults or adolescents in need of drug and alcohol services, but do not require emergent detoxification services, should schedule a Level of Care Assessment (LOCA). This assessment will determine the level of care necessary and is the first step in accessing drug and alcohol treatment services.

In partnership with White Deer Run York, we have established the **York Assessment Center**. Individuals, adults, who feel they may have a problem with drugs and/ or alcohol, may call **717-668-8035** to schedule a level of care assessment (LOCA). An assessment is (*typically*) free of cost to everyone *except* DUI offenders, who may be charged.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

I need detox. What should I do?

Detox is an emergency situation and treatment should be accessed as quickly as possible. Contact the **White Deer Run Admissions Support Center at 1-866-769-6822.** They are available 24/7.

What if I cannot afford treatment?

The York/Adams Drug & Alcohol Commission was established to financially assist individuals who would normally be unable to afford treatment. The Commission works with the Department of Human Services along with treatment providers to ensure that treatment is affordable.

I have insurance but it doesn't cover my treatment?

Act 106 of 1989 requires all commercial group health plans to provide comprehensive treatment for alcohol and drug addictions.

What type of treatment do you help to fund?

The York/Adams Drug & Alcohol Commission assists with funding for Outpatient, Intensive Outpatient, Partial Hospitalization, Halfway House, Inpatient Rehab, and Inpatient Detox levels of care. The Commission helps to fund the appropriate level of care for individuals based upon need
